DIRECTIONS

Civic Center Park at the corner of 13th Ave. and Acoma Street. To get from Denver International Airport to downtown Denver, follow Peña Blvd. about 10 miles until it merges with I-70. Continue west approximately another 10 miles on I-70 to I-25. Exit I-70 west and go south on I-25. Proceed south on I-25 to the Colfax Ave exit. Turn left (east) on Colfax Ave. to Bannock St. The heart of downtown and all the hotels listed below are located to your left (north). To proceed to the museum, turn right (south) on Bannock St. to 12th Ave. The Cultural Complex Parking Garage, located at the corner of 12th Ave. and Broadway, is recommended for museum parking. Parking rates, which start at \$1 per hour, are posted inside the entrance. Cash or credit card payment is accepted in the Cultural Complex garage. There are many other lots in the area, within a five-minute walk of the museum. Most require payment in advance.

All day handicapped accessible parking is located in the Cultural Center garage. Do not park on the street at handicapped designated areas as these are for short term handicapped parking only.

DINING

Optional boxed lunch will be located in Ponti Events space which is located in the North Building. Boxed lunches must be purchased in advance, by 10/26/12, and will not be available for purchase the day of the event.

There are multiple options for lunch on your own. Palettes Restaurant (Fine Dining, American Cuisine) is located in the North Building of the DAM. Mad Greens (salads & sandwiches) is located on the Martin Plaza level of the exterior of the Cultural Center Parking Garage. Pints Pub and Dozens (both offering salads, soups, sandwiches) are located at 13th & Bannock.
